What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small piece of data that a website asks your browser to store on your computer or mobile device. The cookie allows the website to "remember" your actions or preferences over time.

Most Internet browsers support cookies; however, users can set their browsers to decline certain types of cookies or specific cookies. Further, users can delete cookies at any time.

Why We Use Cookies

Most pages on our site use cookies to provide web traffic statistics through Google Analytics, to allow our applications to run efficiently, and to identify if you have accepted the use of cookies from this site.

The cookies we use do not collect any personally identifying information about you or provide us with any way to contact you, and the cookies do not extract any information from your computer. There are two types of cookies: (1) First-party cookies are created by the site you visited. The site is shown in the address bar. (2) Third-party cookies are created by sites other than the one you are on. For example, these sites may own some of the content, like ads or images, that you see on a webpage you visit.

We Use the Following Cookies

- **Internal Cookies:** Williams Mullen cookies assist to improve the visitor experience and performance of our website.
- **Google Analytics:** We use Google Analytics to understand how you use our website. This includes looking at where a visitor comes from and where they go when they leave our site. Google provides an opt-out for this tool [here](#).
- **AddThis:** AddThis is a social media bookmarking tool that lets us share our content on social media pages. Oracle, the owner of AddThis, states that browser settings or the link in the Choices section will opt you out of AddThis tools.
